This **KS4 Study Day** will delve into the most recent progress in vaccine research and the history of vaccination. It includes engagement with Oxford research scientists and will be ideal for students interested in medicine, biology, and international development.

At the **History of Science Museum**, they will meet scientists studying vaccination and explore the history of medicine and treatment of disease through interactive workshops.

At the **Bodleian**, they will hone their critical thinking skills by analysing arguments surrounding vaccination.
